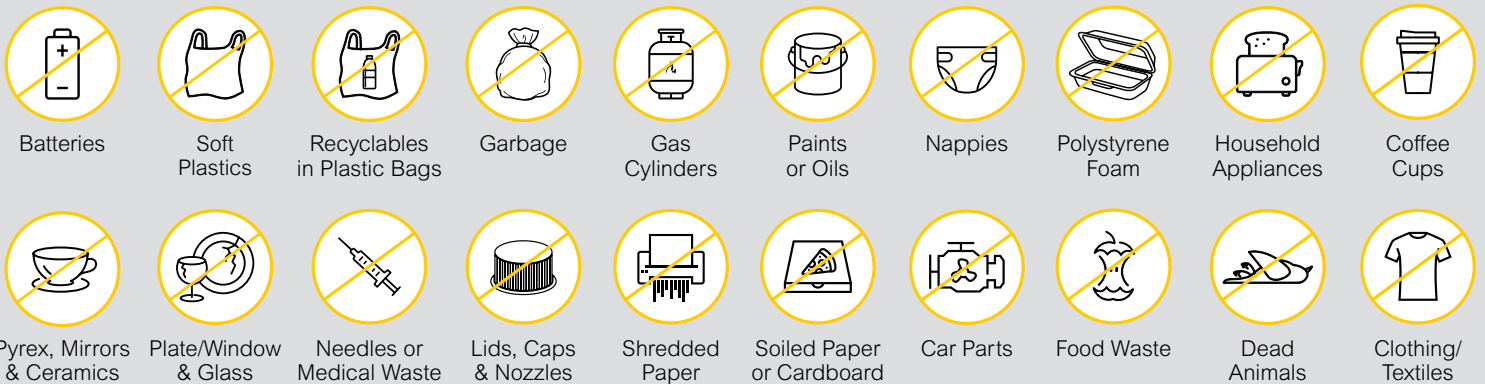


IS YOUR RECYCLING BIN ALWAYS FULL?

DID YOU KNOW?

When garden organics are disposed of in the garbage bin and landfilled, harmful greenhouse gases are produced during the breakdown process. Using your garden organics bin correctly allows for organics to be composted and helps prevent climate change.

Did you also know our garden organics are composted and reused in horticultural and landscaping markets, helping to close the loop on organic waste in Wollondilly?

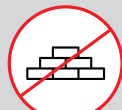

HOUSEHOLD CLEAN-UP

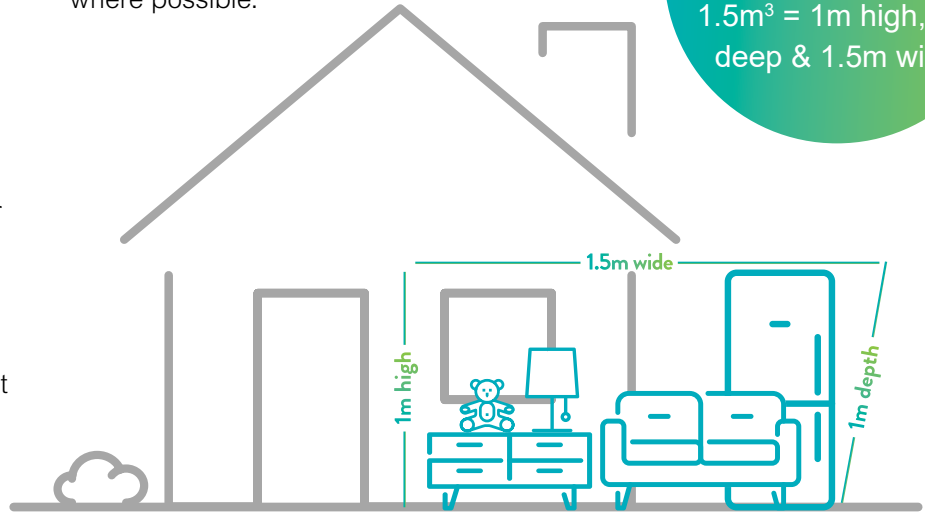
This service is provided to collect household waste and scrap metals.

An information flyer will be mailed to your property which contains your two scheduled collection dates for the new financial year and advises on how best to use this service including what can be accepted. If you misplace this flyer, you can check your dates online at wollondilly.nsw.gov.au/cleanup.

CLEAN-UP INFORMATION

- Items can be placed on the kerb no earlier than 48hrs prior to your property's scheduled collection date. Early or late presentation of your clean up materials may be treated as illegal dumping and can attract a fine.
- Separate any metal or electronic items so these items can be easily recycled.
- Materials cannot be placed out after your collection date in your area as vehicles will not return.
- Piles exceeding the approved size will only have the allowance limit collected. Any remaining waste must be returned to within the private property boundary.
- Place items **directly in front of your property** unless otherwise advised by Council. Place items safely to avoid footpaths and driveways where possible.

LIMIT PER COLLECTION
1.5 cubic metres
1.5m³ = 1m high, 1m deep & 1.5m wide

Household Goods/Loose Items*

Toys, Prams, Clothing, Linen, Crockery, Boxes, Bicycles, Sporting Equipment

*Loose items must be in boxes or bags



Metal Appliances*

Stove, Washers, Dryers, Air Conditioners, Toasters, Hot Water Systems and Refrigerators

*Ensure fridges are empty and any doors/locks are taped or removed

Hazardous Materials

Building and Demolition Waste

Bricks, Concrete, Tiles, Masonry, Baths, Rocks, Gyprock Sheets, Insulation Batts, Items Containing Asbestos, or any Dangerous Waste eg. Barbed Wire



Heavy/Large Items

Tyres, Car Parts, Car batteries, Tree Stumps or Roots, Large objects over 1.8m eg. large dining tables or lounges



Food/General or Garden Waste

Food Scraps, Household Kitchen Waste, Compost, Garden Clippings, Tree branches



Chemical Waste

Paint, Oil, Gas Bottles, Fire Extinguishers, Pesticides, Herbicides, House/Pool Cleaner Liquids of any kind, Hazardous Waste and Chemicals, Commercial or Industrial Waste



Batteries

All types of batteries can be safely disposed of for free at Bargo Waste Management Centre or at your nearest Household Chemical CleanOut event

WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE INFORMATION



Waste Collection Guidelines

- Collection times can vary each week.
- Check there are no obstacles which would limit access to your bins by the collection vehicle.
- Don't park cars in the turning areas of a cul-de-sac or road on a service day.
- Bins can be placed on the kerb up to 48hrs before your service and must be returned back onto your private property within 24hrs following service.

Merry Recyclable Christmas is Happening Again!

This festive season, Council will again be offering weekly collection service of the yellow lid recycling bin to residents due to the success of the last trial.

Council is pleased to provide this service to help residents deal with the high amounts of recycling during this time. It is important to keep valuable resources out of landfill and recycle as much as possible.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Yellow lid recycling bins will be collected on a weekly basis starting Monday 11 December 2023 until Friday 5 January 2024 inclusive. During this period you can place your **yellow lid recycling bin** out with the **red lid garbage bin** for collection each week on your normal collection day. Your **green lid garden organics bin** service would continue as normal on a fortnightly service during this period - check the front cover of this booklet for dates. From Monday 8 January 2024 the **yellow lid recycling bin** collection returns to the normal fortnightly collection.

Don't forget - Any really large pieces or quantities of recycling that won't fit in your bin can be taken to **Bargo Waste Management Centre** and put in the correct recycling stations **FREE** of charge!

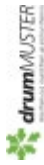
BARGO WASTE MANAGEMENT CENTRE

Save time and money by sorting your waste. The following items are accepted **FREE** of charge when placed into the correct recycling station:

- Scrap metal & appliances
- Paper & cardboard
- Plastic containers numbered 1-7
- Car, truck & household batteries
- Motor oil
- Glass bottles & jars
- Milk & juice cartons
- Aluminium cans
- E-waste
- Clean white polystyrene

Please **cover your load** when transporting your materials. On entry remain in your vehicle until you receive instructions from weighbridge staff and **make sure you wear enclosed footwear**.



DrumMuster is the national program for the collection and recycling of eligible non-returnable crop production and animal health product chemical containers from manufacturers participating in the Industry Waste Reduction Scheme.

RETURN & EARN

Most drink containers between 150mL and 3L are accepted and can get a 10c refund when taken to an approved NSW collection point.

Containers should be empty, uncrushed, unbroken and have the original label attached. If a container isn't eligible for a refund it can still be recycled in your recycling bin.

HOUSEHOLD CHEMICAL CLEANOUT

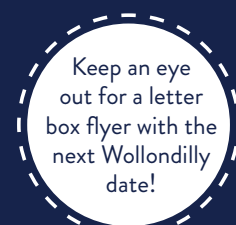
Help protect Wollondilly's environment by safely disposing of potentially hazardous household chemicals at free Chemical CleanOut events.

For information on free household chemical cleanouts and to see collection dates and locations, please visit **www.cleanout.com.au** or call the EPA Environment Line on **131 555**. Only household quantities accepted. Maximum container size of 20kg or 20L per item. Up to 100L of paint now accepted.

The following materials can be dropped off:

- Paint & related products
- Gas bottles
- Hobby chemicals
- Pesticides/herbicides
- Fire extinguishers
- Smoke detectors
- Poisons
- Oils
- Solvents & household cleaners
- Motor oils, fuels & fluids
- Pool chemicals
- Ammonia based cleaners
- Batteries (household & car)
- Acids & alkalis
- Fluorescent globes & tubes

Please transport your materials carefully and remain in your vehicle at the collection site.



PROTECT OUR ENVIRONMENT

STOP ILLEGAL DUMPING IN OUR SHIRE

Help us to stop the illegal dumping of waste along roadsides and in the bush. Illegal dumping is the disposal of waste larger than litter on land or in water without the correct approvals.

Illegal dumping can include:

- Placing unwanted household items on the footpath when there is no council collection.
- Dumping rubbish or garden organics in the bush or on the side of a road.
- Dumping asbestos waste.
- Businesses or contractors who are paid to correctly dispose of commercial waste but instead dump it on land without proper approvals.

Report illegal dumping

REPORT LITTERING

Roadside litter is a significant problem. Litter damages our environment, harms wildlife and sea creatures, can injure people and is very expensive to clean up. If you see someone littering from a vehicle or materials blown or escaping from vehicles you can make a report to the EPA. Fines issued from a report range from \$250 for an individual and \$500 for a business/corporation. HELP OUR KOALAS

DID YOU KNOW THERE ARE KOALAS IN WOLLONDILLY?

Yes, and in fact the first koala sighted by Europeans was from Bargo. In 1798, John Price wrote: *'There is another animal that the natives call Cullawine, which much resembles the Sloth in America.'*

Due to recent surveys we now know koalas are all over Wollondilly, and have been actively recorded in Campbelltown since the 1990s.

Koalas love a local tree species called a Grey Gum (Eucalyptus punctata) amongst a few others. You can find these important food trees at the Robin Davies Wollondilly Community Nursery. This tree can also be found across much of Wollondilly, in areas where the geology transitions from clay to sandstone.



How can you help?

Put your hand up to help keep koalas healthy and flourishing across the Shire!

Contact Greater Sydney Landcare about joining the Southwest Sydney Koala Project. This is an on-ground koala habitat restoration project which offers small grants to encourage corridors across the landscape. If you are a landholder of more than one hectare of Wollondilly bushland, or with paddocks of scattered trees please contact Xuela Sledge, Koala Officer, Greater Sydney Landcare xuela.sledge@greatersydneylandcare.org or **0409 877 566**.

The Southwest Sydney Koala Project is also available for education to any individual or group in the wider Wollondilly community including schools (all levels), Scouts, TAFE, University, volunteer or community groups.



THE ROBIN DAVIES WOLLONDILLY COMMUNITY NURSERY

The Robin Davies Wollondilly Community Nursery grows a variety of local native plants including grasses, groundcovers, shrubs, climbers and trees.

Nursery staff can help you choose plants suited to your garden or farm that will look great, be waterwise, low maintenance and help support wildlife.

The plants are grown by our dedicated volunteers, the Wollondilly Regenerators and Propagators (WRAP). New volunteers are always welcome.

Residents of the Wollondilly Shire are entitled to 20 plants per year with the attached vouchers.

Each voucher can be redeemed for 5 plants per quarter. Plant stocks at the nursery vary seasonally throughout the year so it is always worth coming back for that special plant you haven't seen before.

SUPPORT BIODIVERSITY BY PLANTING NATIVE GRASSES

Grasses play a crucial role in maintaining healthy ecosystems and provide numerous benefits, including:

- Deep fibrous roots help to stabilise soil and prevent erosion.
- Provide habitat, nesting material and food sources for insects, frogs, birds and small mammals.
- Help maintain good water quality by filtering pollutants and sediment from stormwater runoff before it enters the waterways.
- Improve soil fertility by adding organic matter and nutrients to the soil.
- Minimise weed growth by acting as a living mulch.
- Provide drought tolerant features in the garden.

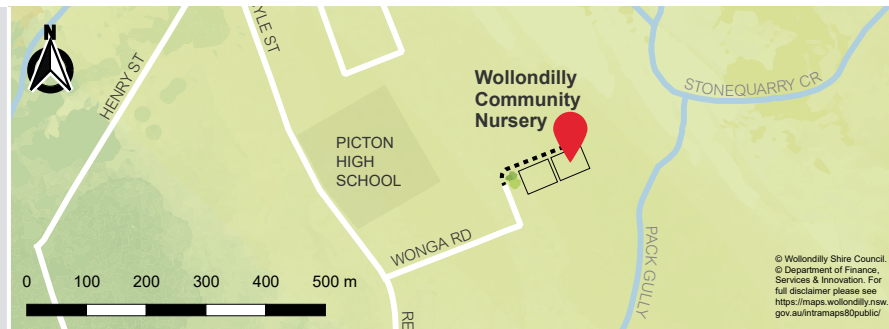
