





### Request to extend existing Bus Zones in Menangle St with an additional time restricted Bus Zone outside Soldiers Memorial, Picton.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Council has received a request from Picton Buslines to extend the existing Bus Zone in Menangle St with an additional time restricted Bus Zone outside Soldiers Memorial on Menangle St, Picton to cater for its buses for the school and improve safety for the school children.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That Council approve a time restricted Bus Zone (R5-20) outside Soldiers Memorial, Picton and the restricted time will be:

8.30am – 9.30am and 2.30pm – 3.30pm, School Days only.

Action: No objection - confirmation to occur in terms of time.

Judith Hannan asked how often the extra space is required. Chris Moule states the original request came from the School Principal. The school currently has room for two bus loading zones out the front. When these are full, two other buses wait at Colden Street, and another two wait out front of the Council Depot in Margaret Street, at times blocking the driveway. The extension would mean that four buses can load/unload school children at a time, so there are only two more buses waiting on Colden Street, and none waiting at Margaret Street. This means buses are loading/unloading faster and can get out of the CBD. This arrangement won't create issues in terms of street parking and creates safer outcomes for all.

Mick Tanner suggests the time be from 8:00 to 9:30 as the area is inside a 40km/h school zone, keeping the speed restriction times and parking restriction times to the same period. This will avoid confusion between parking and speed signs for motorists.







Re: ANZAC DAY 1017 – ROAD CLOSURES WARRAGAMBA

Once again Warragamba & District ANZAC Committee will being holding a march from the Warrragamba/Silverdale Neighbourhood Centre to Memorial Park (opposite the Warragamba Town Hall) and the cenotaph, where we will hold our service. The parade will commence at 11.00am and the service will conclude at approximately 12.00 We are hoping that a police officer in his vehicle will lead the parade, followed by the Blacktown Pipe Band, service personnel, relatives of service personnel and cadets representing the Air force and Navy along with local organisations and schools. We estimate approximately 250 marching and approximately 5,000 in attendance. Our services have grown greatly in the past few years.

Once the service at the Cenotaph is concluded at approximately 12 midday, the marchers proceed to the Warragamba Workers Club.

To maintain the safety of participants and supportive crowds, we would like to apply to have Fourteenth Street closed to traffic from Twentieth and Fourteenth Streets, to the Neighbourhood Centre for a period of approximately 1 ½ hours from 10.30am to 12 mid-day. The closures will be carried out by the Silverdale Rural Fire Services who are ticketed and this closure should cause little disruption to residents and tourists with detours in place.

Notification of road closures will be by notices at all the prominent areas in the district and notification in the Gazette and letterbox drops. The bus companies will also be notified with alternate routes.

#### Road Closures detouring traffic via alternate roads.

- Detour signs on fourteenth Street at twentieth Street, Traffic to go down Twentieth Street onto Nineteenth Street or back onto Weir Road. One Way Street.
- 2. Detour sign on Nineteenth Street directing traffic to Eighteenth Street.

- 1.3 To provide a high level description of the closures and various traffic, transport and pedestrian management







### CODE OF CONDUCT

The club committee, being duly appointed by the members of the MCCC, is in charge of the cycling event. The committee will administer all cycling events in accordance with this Code of Conduct.

Failure to comply with this Code of Conduct may result in disqualification from the event and possible suspension from racing for a period to be determined by the committee.

- All riders shall comply with the provision of the Australian Road Regulations.
- All riders shall obey the directions of the Traffic Controllers and Marshalls.
- All riders shall have read, be aware of, and comply with the conditions of Road Approval.
- Upon encountering a responding emergency vehicle all riders shall cease racing immediately and comply with the provision of the Australian Road Regulations.
- In the event of a race fall or medical emergency all riders shall cease racing immediate, and to the best of their ability shall;
  - Manage the traffic situation,
  - Render medical assistance,
  - In addition, notify the race committee.
- Riders must ensure that their bicycles are in good mechanical order, and shall not commence, or continue a race, with a faulty bicycle.
- Riders shall not park their motor vehicle on the shoulder of the road, but should obey the directions of the duty marshall in regards to parking.
- The use of offensive or obscene language is not permitted.
- Riding in a dangerous manner is not permitted.
- Loitering on the road at the start/finish line is not permitted.
- Warming up on the race circuit is not permitted after the commencement of the race.
- Riders are responsible to ensure that they remove all waste from the race site.
- Riders shall use the designated toilets provided.
- If a rider withdraws from the event, he/she shall inform the first available Marshall of their withdrawal from the event.
- Riders shall be courteous to all members of the general public.
- Riders are to be aware that cattle and horses may enter onto the roadway, and may be spooked by passing cyclists, thus caution must be applied when passing, and any instructions by the farmer or horse rider shall be adhered to.
- Riders are not permitted to sit on adjoining fences, gates etc. Or in any way to damage adjoining properties.
- Riders should report any concerns, addressed to themselves from the general public, to the race committee.



## NOTICE TO RESIDENTS

The Macarthur Collegians Cycling Club will be conducting bicycle races in 2017 along Ridge Road Oakdale at the below specific dates. Traffic Controllers will be in place from 7:30am till 10am. For the duration of the event approval has been granted by the NSW Police and Wollondilly Council to reduce the speed limit to 60 km/h along this course. 60 km/h repeater signs will be placed along the course to remind residents of the reduced speed limit. Note, this speed limit is enforceable by the NSW Police.







#### **GENERAL BUSINESS**

# 1. <u>Creation of Clearway Until 9am on Corner Argyle Street and Margaret Street,</u> PICTON APPROACHING THE NEW TRAFFIC LIGHTS TO IMPROVE TRAFFIC FLOW IN PEAK TIMES

Chris Moule had been liaising with Amy in this regard, discussing photographs being received of the site. In peak morning times when both lanes are full, cars are obstructing the view of those behind them. Look at parking appropriate, without losing parking considering commercial businesses nearby. Cars cannot turn left from the left due to parking areas. Consider making this a clearway until 9am – this should not interfere with parking areas for nearby commercial businesses. In the afternoon it is not so much of an issue.

Mayor Judith Hannan advises to consult with business owners before any action is taken.

Jayd Marsh raised questions regarding the use of T1 lines. Mike Nelson is looking at whether these are necessary – people tend to head to the geometric centre of Margaret Street and the idea is that the lines keep them heading the right way.

#### 2. MAYOR'S WALK

Council seeks to highlight the great walking and hiking trails throughout the Wollondilly Shire in support of increasing tourism and visitor numbers to the Shire. To bring awareness and to promote the Shire's natural assets, Wollondilly Shire Councillors seek to undertake a continuous trek (23rd-26th March 2017) along the edge of the Nattai Wilderness area, using the existing fire trail network, that can link Warragamba to Thirlmere Lakes National Park. Up to 4 public roads will need to utilised to facilitate this walk as shown on the attached plan.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Council is requesting agreement in principle to the planned walk on public roads subject to the submission of acceptable Traffic Management Plans and Traffic Control Plans to address any concerns with traffic disruption and the safety of the participants.

#### **ACTION:**

This should be treated as a normal non-roadworks event — the Councillors will have to seek permission to walk through catchment areas otherwise heavy road control will need to take place. They are hoping for a resolution by the end of the week, after which time we can formalise an item to circulate electronically for committee feedback. Safety is what is most important - if they can walk through the water board area that would be great. Even with support vehicles it would be risky to walk along Silverdale Road and Barkers Lodge Road. If this is unavoidable, the police have templates as to support vehicles specifications etc. There may be areas where people have to hop into a vehicle, travel to a safer part of road, then continue walking. Mick Tanner and Marcus Cotton discussed a walking event along Menangle Road where any walking along the road wasn't permitted — there was a blanket "No Walking" policy for the event along the stretch. Participants were placed in buses and carried to a safer area for walking.



- 3. Chris Moule raised the speed zone change at Bargo near freeway, just off Hume Highway next to the on to ramp. There are new "80" signs, as well as warnings about the new speed zone change, but there is still "100" on the road. This is causing confusion for some drivers. Discussion as to who is responsible to change the numbering on the road Council or RMS. RMS are responsible.
- 4. Chris Moule discussed traffic at Wollondilly Anglican College. In the mornings there are heap of buses and a lot of parents wanting to enter the school from the southbound lane. This lane becomes full and is queued quite far back. Southbound drivers are then having to go over the shoulder line marking to get around the queue so they can keep going south. At least 20 or more cars each morning will drive ahead past the queue, perform a u-turn and as such crossing double unbroken lanes, doing a u turn to get into the college from the other direction. This action has the potential to cause an accident. Mick Tanner will pass this information to officers to patrol the area in the mornings.
- Compliments and positive feedback on the new roundabout in Picton it has made driving buses out of Jarvisfield much easier.
- 6. Southbound lanes out of Silverdale on Taylor Road where there are concrete barriers up next to an estate being built. With the chevron signs, one arrow pointed into paddock the rest going to a lane. This is causing confusion for other drivers, particular inexperienced drivers. Also an issue in this area are the speed limit signs being faded not showing up in the darkness. It was asked if they could be replaced.
- 7. A resident complaint about bus stop on Argyle Street being moved to the Memorial Park was discussed. This movement was necessary because of the line marking leading up to the traffic lights and was discussed in the November traffic committee meeting and was agreed to by Council. She wants it in front of Shell Garage. There have been no other complaints in regards to the issue. Chris Moule confirmed there is also a bus stop out the front of Council allowing for quick and easy access to Argyle Street.

#### **RMS Report**

8. There has been a change to the speed limit on Remembrance Driveway from 100km to 80km at Razorback. Formal notification will come from RMS to come soon.

### **Police Report**

- 9. Mick Tanner requested an update on Broughton Pass Bridge. Mike Nelson confirms a letter of acceptance sent the day before Christmas Eve for a Design and Construct Contract. Commencement is to happen on site in early March. Program still the same.
- 10. A complaint has been made about a bus stop Thirlmere Way. It's an old bus shelter sitting in a large dip in a road where there are obvious drainage issues. To collect and disembark passengers, the bus is stopping on the road, blocking views and the road for oncoming traffic. Mike Nelson and Norma raised that it's part of a project that's on the grants that we have and it will be done by the end of the financial year. Other bus stops in similar states that are part of the project have had work commence on them, so work on this bus stop will likely happen sooner rather than later.

#### CLOSING

There being no further business, the Local Traffic Meeting was declared closed at 3:00pm.
