EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This report recommends that Council apply to the NSW Department of Primary Industries (Crown Lands) to transfer the Crown Roads known as Antill Street and Bell Street, Thirlmere to Council as Public Roads.
- Council advise the Crown Lands that it does not intend to close and sell the road reserve in the foreseeable future.
- All costs associated with the transfer and construction of the unformed part of Antill and Bell Streets to be borne by the applicant.
- That the Mayor and General Manager be authorised to execute all documentation in relation to this matter including those requiring the Common Seal of Council.

REPORT

An application has been received by Council to apply to the NSW Department of Primary Industries for the transfer of ownership of portions of Crown Roads known as Antill Street and Bell Street, Thirlmere to Council as Public Roads. The application has been received due to development applications being lodged for subdivisions under DA854/2015, DA855/2015 and DA856/2015.

Council's Infrastructure & Planning Department advised that it was in the best interest of Council to apply for the whole of both roads rather than portions as requested by the applicant. The map below highlights the proposed road area in orange to be transferred as public road.

All sections of Antill and Bell Streets that are currently formed are maintained by Council except for one section (approximately 87 metres) along Antill Street that will need to be constructed to Council standards as part of the relevant development applications.

Council are required to state in writing to the Department of Primary Industries that it does not intend to close and sell these roads in the foreseeable future and that these roads are required for construction and/or maintenance of access.



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Once the application has been received by the Department of Primary Industries, all transfers will be arranged within that Department including advertisement in the Government Gazette.
