#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- The purpose of this report is to advise that a Late Report will be provided for consideration to the 16 May 2016 Meeting of Council summarising the tender process for the proposed Picton Sportsground Pedestrian Bridge.
- The Tender assessment had not sufficiently progressed to enable a complete report to be included with the Business Paper.
- The Late Report will recommend an outcome based on the tender assessment, which is expected to be the recommendation to enter into a contract with a preferred tenderer.

#### REPORT

At its April 2015 Council meeting, Council resolved to proceed with a Pedestrian Bridge located near the bend of the shared pathway behind Magnolia Drive to the Sportsground normally accessed off Fairley's Road.

Open tenders were called in accordance with the Local Government Act 1993 (NSW) and the Local Government (General) Regulation 2005 (NSW). The details of the calling, closing and opening of tenders are:

- Tenders were called on 22 March 2016
- Tenders were advertised in the Sydney Morning Herald, via Tenderlink, Bush Telegraph and on Council's Website
- Non-Compulsory Pre Tender Briefing Sessions were held on-site on 4 and 13 April 2016
- Tenders closed on 19 April 2016.

A total of fifteen (15) submissions were received from ten (10) different parties as follows:
