TENDER 2016/06 PICTON SPORTSGROUND PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCT

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The purpose of this report is to recommend acceptance of a tender for the Picton Sportsground Pedestrian Link Bridge Design and Construct Contract in accordance with the Local Government Act 1993 and the Local Government (General) Regulation 2005.
- It is recommended:
 - That in accordance with the Local Government (General) Regulation 2005, Clause 178 (1) (a), Council accept Option 2 of the tender from Fleetwood Urban Pty Ltd ABN 41 000 789 748 for the Picton Sportsground Pedestrian Link Bridge Design and Construct Contract for the tendered sum of \$425,221 (excluding GST) in response to Tender 2016/06.
 - 2. That Council delegate to the General Manager (or their delegate) the authority to finalise and execute the Contract and any other documentation required to give effect to the resolution, including those requiring the Common Seal of Council.
 - 3. That no contract be formed between the parties until the Execution of the Formal Instrument of Agreement by both parties.
 - 4. That the shortfall in budget allocation be sourced from the Sportsground Restricted Cash Account in the 2016/17 Capital Budget.

REPORT

BACKGROUND

At its April 2015 Council meeting, Council resolved to proceed with a Pedestrian Bridge located near the bend of the shared pathway behind Magnolia Drive to the Sportsground normally accessed off Fairley's Road. A number of other resolutions were made by Council at the April 2015 meeting to address some of the concerns expressed by the community during the consultation period. These included:

- That Council formalise the existing overflow parking at Picton Sportsground in conjunction with the Picton Sportsground Pedestrian Bridge construction
- That the parking situation in nearby residential areas be monitored following construction of the Picton Sportsground Pedestrian Bridge
- That any future upgrades to Picton Sportsground make provisions for adequate parking for sportsground users



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Subject to adoption of the recommendations, It is anticipated that work will start toward the end 2015/16 FY and be completed in the 2016/17 FY.

TENDERS

Open tenders were called in accordance with the Local Government Act 1993 (NSW) and the Local Government (General) Regulation 2005 (NSW). The details of the calling, closing and opening of tenders are:

- Tenders were called on the 22nd March 2016
- Tenders were advertised in the Sydney Morning Herald, via Tenderlink, Bush Telegraph and on Council's Website
- Non-Compulsory Pre Tender Briefing Sessions was held on-site on the 4th and 13th April 2016
- Tenders Closed on the 19th April 2016

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On this basis the following two tenders were considered non-complying and not further considered by the Evaluation Panel:

- Moodie Outdoor Products Pty Ltd
- Timber Restoration Systems Pty Ltd Option 3

The remaining tenders were scored individually by the Evaluation Panel members and aggregated into a single score for each Tender with the following Criteria:

Fleetwood Urban Pty Ltd provided two tenders (Options 1 and 2) that were ranked 2nd and 1st respectively at the end of the scoring process. Tender Option 2 was the preferred tender as it offered better flood compatibility and a design more aligned to the intended use of the location i.e. access to a regional sporting facility.

On this basis, the Tender Assessment Panel unanimously agreed to recommended acceptance of Option 2 of the tender from Fleetwood Urban Pty Ltd ABN 41 000 789 748 for the Picton Sportsground Pedestrian Link Bridge Design and Construct Contract in response to Tender 2016/06. The details of the assessment are contained within a confidential attachment to this report.

CONSULTATION

The Tender Evaluation Panel for Tender 2016-6 included representatives from Infrastructure Planning and Works Sections.



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Council consulted the community in the early stages of this project and this resulted in a resolution to formalise the existing overflow parking at Picton Sportsground in conjunction with the Picton Sportsground Pedestrian Bridge construction. A budget allocation has been included in the project funding in order to achieve this outcome.

It should also be noted that roadwork will be carried out on Fairleys Road as part of the 2016/17 Pavement Reconstruction Program that will assist with on street parking to further increase capacity.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The budget that was been allocated in the 2015/16 Operational Plan for the project is \$397,000 and expenditure estimated to the end of 2015/16 is estimated at \$50,000 which includes works to date (including geotechnical investigations and tender document preparation).

The March 2016 Quarterly Budget Review being presented to the May Council meeting is recommending that \$347,000 of the project budget be reallocated into the 2016/17 budget as this is when the bulk of the works will be completed.

The tendered sum for the works under Contract is \$425,221. Works completed to date totals \$50,000 and an allowance for other works at the sportsground, outside the contracted engagement, is estimated at up to \$75,000 and includes commencement of pathway linkages and the provision of overflow parking.

As such the total expected expenditure for this project and associated works is expected to total approximately \$550,000. The estimated shortfall for the project compared to current allocations is \$153,000.

It is recommended that an additional budget allocation of \$153,000 be allocated from Council's Sportsground Restricted Cash Account in the 2016/17 Capital Budget.
