Key issues identified in facilitated Sessions

- Environment

Environment

- Key consideration resource value of the land and environmental constraints.
- Specialist studies assess proposal against environmental standards / criteria.
- Studies are assessed internally and by State Agencies (eg., Office of Water, Office of Environment & Heritage).
- Dual approval process (eg., Federal approval under EPBC Act for disturbance to critically endangered communities).



Infrastructure

Infrastructure to support growth is secured by a combination of the following:

- 1. Direct Works
 - New roads, extension of water and sewer.
- 2. State Infrastructure Contribution
 - for urban release areas satisfactory arrangements must be made for State Public Infrastructure prior to subdivision (eg., PTTAG contribution to widening of the Hume Highway).
- 3. Section 94 Contribution Plans
 - Capped at \$20K per lot for new works.
- 4. Voluntary Planning Agreement
 - Contribution can exceed the \$20k cap. Not restricted to new assets (eg., Appin Inn).



Heritage / Rural Lifestyle

- 1. Heritage Provisions in Council's LEP.
 - identifies 17 Heritage Items (eg., Brennan / Larkin / Winton Farms).
- 2. Rural Lifestyle vision in Council's Community Strategic Plan.
 - Maintain village feel.
 - Maintain heritage buildings.
 - Divert traffic.
