

With a record \$190.7 million anticipated spending on an extensive capital works program over the next four years, Wollondilly Shire Council's next draft Operational Plan and Budget continues to place a massive investment into roads and priority infrastructure assets across the Shire as Council prepares for the growth ahead.

The program includes a significant \$57.3 million investment in 2024/25 for infrastructure delivery all across the Shire, from Warragamba to Yanderra, Oakdale to Menangle and Appin to Thirlmere.

A proposed budget of \$30.9 million for roads in 2024/25 will build on the massive investment in recent years, with an emphasis on road renewal. The upcoming year will also see the creation of a new civil road crew, as well as additional road surveillance and inspection resources.

Along with another record investment in roads and infrastructure projects, in the year ahead Council will continue to place a strong focus on continuous improvement, enhanced service delivery and organisational performance.

When it comes to planning for the future, more resources will be focussed on rural and employment planning and growth area management, supporting the viability of agriculture and affordable farming across the Shire and creating jobs and sustainable outcomes in our growth areas.

Council will also concentrate on improving the customer experience, with the Customer Experience Enhancement Plan driving delivery of excellent customer service through all Council's interactions, projects and initiatives for the coming year.

Wollondilly Council is **trialling a new free wood chipping service** in four key

If you have off-cuts from larger vegetation such as tree branches and large shrubs this service is for you.

USING THE SERVICE

WE WILL ACCEPT:

- Tree branches, trunks and large shrubs
- Length: one metre or more
- ✓ Diameter: maximum is 400mm

WE WILL NOT ACCEPT:

- × Tree stumps or root balls
- × Vines and garden weeds (e.g. dandelions, thistles, etc)
- × Woody weed species that are fruiting or in seed
- ✗ Grass clippings, hedge trimmings, palm leaves
- × Posts, stakes, sleepers, wire and ropes
- × Material that is tied up or in bags
- × Material with dirt or soil
- × Metal, concrete, building materials or general waste

Picton to Tahmoor Shareway:

2.4 km of shared pathway.

Old Menangle School Recreation Area:

Includes the renewal of the old school building, playground and nature play areas, community kitchen and garden, BBQ and shelter facilities and new amenities building.

Picton Botanic Gardens Playspace and Amenities:

Includes an all abilities toddler and children's playspace with sensory elements and water play.

Barrallier Park Water Play, The Oaks:

This play facility will be completed soon and will be open for community use in Spring 2024.

OTHER PROJECTS ON THE GO:

Wollondilly Performing Arts Centre:

External works are nearly complete with the focus now on the internal works.

Sportsgrounds at The Oaks, Tahmoor and Picton:

Includes a new multi-purpose building at Dudley Chesham Sportsground, a field upgrade at the Tahmoor Sporting Complex and a building extension at Picton Sportsground.



LAND FOR JOBS

More local jobs are on the horizon thanks to the recent rezoning of land in Bridge St, Picton.

On 12 April 2024 an amendment to the Wollondilly Local Environmental Plan 2011 was made in relation to the land at 120-140 Bridge Street. This will rezone the land from RU2 Rural Landscape to E4 General Industrial and also provide measures for the protection of environmentally sensitive land on the site. The changes will enable the expansion of an existing business and provide additional employment land.

ROADWORKS AROUND THE SHIRE



Our road teams and contractors are fixing, repairing and maintaining Wollondilly roads every weekday.

Silverdale Road Safety Improvement Program: Work around the Silverdale Shopping Centre will finalise the project, with timing dependent on the construction of the Centre. We have already completed road reconstruction and widening, kerb and guttering and footpaths, completely changing traffic movements within Silverdale.

Razorback Landslip: Work is continuing on Remembrance Driveway, Razorback to repair a rock fall and historic landslip which has seen a lane closed since 2010. The stabilisation process is progressing well and causing minimal disruption to traffic on the major thoroughfare.

Footpaths: New footpaths have been installed at John Street and Russell Street, The Oaks. They will improve pedestrian safety and increase opportunities for exercise, which is a win-win.

Burragorang Road and Fosters Lane, Mount Hunter: NSW Black Spot Funding has allowed for asphalt reconstruction in Mount Hunter to repair the road at the intersection.

Night Road Work: We have recently completed some nighttime road reconstruction on main roads to limit disruptions to traffic. The work on Menangle Road, Menangle and Argyle Street, Picton is now completed.

Kerb and Guttering: Our crews have been replacing some kerb and guttering in Tahmoor, with more to come.

Drainage and Pothole Maintenance: With recent flooding, our Civil Maintenance and Drainage team has been repairing potholes and responding to drainage requests through our Customer Portal.

WATER IN Wollondilly

Did you know that 95% of Sydney's drinking water comes from or through Wollondilly? Council is currently looking at ways of improving stormwater management, with a particular focus on areas within the Sydney Drinking Water Catchment.

We have partnered with WaterNSW to audit the existing stormwater quality improvement devices such as gross pollutant traps and artificial wetlands. The audit will identify the need to carry out additional maintenance, such as cleaning and repairs. Maintaining good water quality in our rivers is important for stock watering, irrigation and recreation, as well as the ecological health of native plants and animals,

We will soon be launching a community survey to find out the general understanding of stormwater management. Stay tuned - we would love you to take part!
